## 1 An Abbreviation

First use: specific learning difference (SpLD). Next use: SpLD.

Access name: specific learning difference.

If the access field isn't set in the above, no replacement text is used in the corresponding `\glstext`, `\glsaccessstext` etc commands.

Text field: SpLD [no-index/link version: SpLD]. Short field: SpLD [no-index/link version: SpLD].

## 2 An Initialism

The short form should be read as two letters: P I (not as the word pi).

First use: Private Investigator (PI). Next use: PI.

Access short: Private Investigator. Actual short value: PI. Access (name): Private Investigator.

## 3 A Symbol

First use:  $\Re$ . Next use:  $\Re$ . Text field:  $\Re$ . Name field:  $\Re$ .

First use:  $\in$ . Next use:  $\in$ . Text field:  $\in$ . Name field:  $\in$ .

Now test in math-mode:

The “firstaccess” field is used on first use. If this hasn't been set the “access” field is used instead. The “textaccess” field is used on subsequent use. If this hasn't been set the “access” field is used instead. The “access” field is used for the entry name in the glossary list.
